Summary

Subject: PUBLIC HEARING - AUTHORIZATION TO ACCEPT GRANT FUNDING, APPROVE EXPENDITURE RECOMMENDATIONS AND BUDGET MODIFICATIONS AS REQUIRED

Recommendation: Adopt a resolution authorizing the Chief of Police to accept the FY 2008/2009 California Citizens' Option for Public Safety (COPS) funding and approve expenditure recommendations. Further, authorize the Chief Financial Officer to make budget adjustments as necessary.

Fiscal Impact: \$100,848 account 2180-69201 (State Grant Law Enforcement-Equipment) – (No City match required)

Background: Each year, dependent upon State Budget priorities, funds may be allocated to law enforcement agencies to assist in carrying out priorities as established by the Chief of Police (or the Sheriff in unincorporated areas or contract cities). A screening committee consisting of a City Manager, County Administrative Officer, Police Chief, Sheriff and the District Attorney act as a budgetary review panel on the expenditure of these funds as mandated by State Statute

We have been notified by the State Department of Finance, the State Budget will allocate \$100,848 for the Yuba City Police Department. No cash match required in either instance.

Analysis: The Police Department has traditionally utilized funding obtained in this grant for the major approval expenditure category of technology advancements and infrastructure improvements for the benefit of frontline law enforcement delivery to the citizens of our community. Funding directions are based upon needs assessments from the Department management group in consultation with the rank and file employees and direction from the City's IT staff and our Research and Development Unit. Prior years expenditures have been for such items as: Complete infrastructure upgrade of the Police Radio system

inclusive of acquisition of a secondary repeater radio frequency and related equipment, the Sutter Buttes Radio Interoperability Project Phase One, Emergency Operations Center retrofit, a total service weapon upgrade for all officers, equipping all patrol vehicles with mobile data terminals integrated with the Police Communications Center, required upgrades in the Fire/Police Computer Aided Dispatching System, installation of secure video conferencing capabilities, acquisition of satellite emergency communications capabilities with the California Office of Emergency Services (California Warning Center) and FEMA, phasing of a back-up Police/Fire Communications Site and bio-toxin testing equipment. We would suggest a continuation along this path of technology evaluation and implementation, which has served us very well over the last 10 years and gained the City both State and National recognition as a technological leader in law enforcement.

Fiscal Impact: The City will receive \$100,848 from the State of California under the Citizens' Option for Public Safety Grant.

Alternatives: Provide staff with alternative spending paths which will not supplant routine expenditures in the general fund.

Recommendation: By resolution, authorize the Chief of Police to accept the FY 2008-2009 State of California Citizens' Option for Public Safety Grant and approve the suggested general expenditure category as listed. Additionally, authorize the Chief Financial Officer to make budget adjustments as necessary.

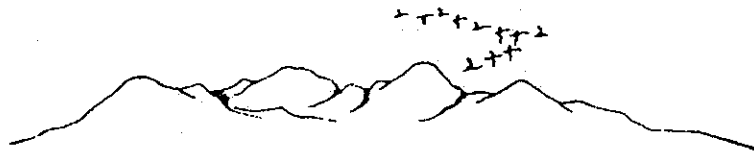

3. Prior to expenditure, funds will be held in appropriate fund tracking accounts and bear interest as allowed. Purchases will be in accordance with established City purchasing guidelines and policies.
