SUBJ: **City Manager's Weekly Report**

Public Works

- **Plumas Streetscape Project:** Staff from the Public Works Department held meetings with the merchants to discuss DBA President Don Covey's proposal of completing the remainder of the project in one phase. The majority of the merchants have selected the option of completing the project as originally planned in two additional phases. Completing the remainder of the project in one phase would have resulted in construction time savings. Proceeding with the work in two phases keeps the schedule on track for completion as originally planned.
- **Harter Road/Hwy. 20 Intersection Signal:** The southerly connection of the Highway 20 intersection with Harter Road was completed and the signal was turned on Tuesday, November 6, 2007.

Parks & Recreation

- **Punt, Pass and Kick:** Yuba City Resident, Andrea Little, competed this past weekend in the NFL Pepsi Punt, Pass and Kick in Daly City. She, along with five other participants, moved onto Sectionals after winning their respective age divisions at the Yuba City PPK hosted by the Yuba City Recreation Department. Andrea won her age group, Girls 10 - 11, at Sectionals and will continue on to compete at the Team Championships at the San Francisco 49er game on November 18. A win at the 49er game will take Andrea to National Competition at the Super Bowl.
- **Senior Center Activities:** On Thursday, October 18th the Senior Center hosted a flu shot clinic for the older population. Sponsored by the Sutter County Health Department, the clinic served almost 300 individuals over the course of two hours. For older adults the risk of a simple cold virus becoming pneumonia is high so it is imperative to protect ourselves for the upcoming flu season.

On October 25, the Senior Center provided a superb informational forum on Relationships and Dating for Older Adults. The panel of guest speakers covered a variety of topics including a

testimonial of a successful E-harmony match! More than a third of Americans over 50 are divorced, widowed, separated or have never married, according to a tally of statistics released in 2006 by the U.S. Census Bureau.
