### **Administration**

The Yuba-Sutter Transit Authority has set a public hearing to be held on Thursday **October 16, 2008** at 4:00 p.m. at the Yuba County Board of Supervisors Chambers. The Transit Board of Directors is asking to receive comments on proposed local and rural route and schedule changes that, if approved, would become effective on or after January 5, 2009. **Senior Center Nutrition Report:** Beginning September 8<sup>th</sup> YC Unified School District—River Valley High School kitchen staff, Fremont-Rideout Foundation, YC Senior Center staff, and senior volunteers pulled together to supply 984 meals through October 1<sup>st</sup>. The seniors are grateful to these agencies who took responsibility for finding and organizing the volunteer staff. Volunteers consisted of ten seniors performing duties such as serving, set up and clean up, and three senior clerical volunteers. The meals could not have happened without the commitment from the above providers.

On October 7, there will be a new meal's provider, Community Action Agency of Butte County, who currently prepares nutrition meals in the Butte County area. Meals will be cooked at their main kitchen in Oroville then transported to Yuba City, Marysville, Wheatland and Brownsville. The

provider will receive funds from Area 4 Agency on Agency through June 30, 2009, when they will re-apply for the new fiscal year, hoping to provide congregate and home delivered meals to the Yuba-Sutter area seniors for 2009-2010.
