Summary

Subject: Annexation of Wildewood East Subdivision

Recommendation: Authorize the Public Works Director to prepare an application requesting the

Sutter Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) to initiate proceedings

for the reorganization of territory.

Fiscal Impact: None to City. Staff time to prepare application will be reimbursed by

Wildewood East Mutual Water Company.

Purpose:

To annex the Wildewood East Subdivision, located on the north side of Franklin Road west of George Washington Boulevard, at the request of the property owners.

Background:

The Wildewood East Subdivision is located on the north side of Franklin Road, west of George Washington Boulevard. The community includes 48 lots, each approximately one (1) acre in size. The Wildewood East Mutual Water Company (WEMWC) serves water to the subdivision through a private groundwater system, which is subject to regulation by the State Water Resources Control Board Division of Drinking Water (State Water Board). In 2014, the State Water Board implemented a lower maximum contaminant level for hexavalent chromium (CR6), which caused WEMWC's groundwater to be out of compliance.

WEMWC hired an engineering consultant to prepare a study to analyze options to gain compliance with the State Water Board's CR6 requirement. The study evaluated five options:

- 1. Abandon the WEMWC well and have Yuba City provide all domestic and irrigation water.
- 2. Maintain the WEMWC well for irrigation purposes only and have Yuba City provide domestic water.
- Maintain the WEMWC well and blend water from Yuba City to reduce CR6 levels.
- 4. Maintain the existing WEMWC system and treat water with a central water treatment plant.
- 5. Maintain the existing WEMWC system and treat domestic water at each receiving home.

With Options 1 – 3, annexation to the City of Yuba City is a requirement of receiving City water.

The WEMWC shareholders, comprised of the majority of the property owners within the subdivision, held a meeting on August 23, 2016. The shareholders voted and selected to proceed with Option 2, which provided for a new City-maintained water distribution system throughout the subdivision, with domestic water service provided to every home.

On May 31, 2017, a Sacramento County Superior Court judgment invalidated the State Water Board's CR6 maximum contaminant level for drinking water. With that invalidation, WEMWC's groundwater was no longer out of compliance with the CR6 maximum contaminant level. WEMWC no longer needs to connect to City water. However, the property owners would like to proceed with annexation to the City. Attached are a Notice of Intent to Circulate Petition and a Landowner Petition signed by 44 of the property owners, as of September 2016.

Analysis:

In order to initiate annexation proceedings with LAFCo, staff needs to prepare an application. The application includes information related to land use, neighboring properties, boundaries of the proposed annexation, a plan for services, public services provided, property tax exchange, and environmental compliance. Staff is requesting authorization from the City Council to prepare the application. Once the application is complete, staff will return to Council to request formal approval to initiate the annexation proceedings with LAFCo.

Fiscal Impact:

There are no fiscal impacts associated with preparing the application. The WEMWC will reimburse the City for staff time and fees associated with the application.

Alternatives:

Do not proceed with the process to annex the Wildewood East Subdivision.

Recommendation:

Authorize the Public Works Director to prepare an application requesting the Sutter Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) to initiate proceedings for the reorganization of territory.



NOTICE OF INTENT TO CIRCULATE PETITION

Before circulating any petition for change of organization, the proponent shall file with the Executive Officer a notice of intention that shall include the name and mailing address of the proponent and a written statement, not to exceed 500 words in length, setting forth the reasons for the proposal. (Government Code, § 56700.4.) The notice shall be signed by a representative of the proponent. After the filing the notice of intent, the petition may be circulated for signatures.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN OF THE INTENTION TO CIRCULATE A PETITION PROPOSING TO:

Annex the Wildewood East subdivision into Yuba City for the purposes of having Yuba City supply the properties in Wildewood East subdivision with domestic water supply. Wildewood East is a community in unincorporated Sutter County, just outside of Yuba City, California. The community includes 48 lots, each measuring approximately 1 acre in size. The community of Wildewood East encompasses Gabriel Avenue and Daniel Drive, as shown in Figure 1.

The purpose of the proposed annexation is to ensure the Wildewood East subdivision complies with newly amended Hexavalent Chromium standards which the State Water Resources Control Board Division of Drinking Water (State Water Board) adopted in 2014. Currently, the Wildewood East Mutual Water Company (WEMUC) provides groundwater to each parcel in the Wildewood East subdivision. However, the existing groundwater does not comply with the new, more stringent Hexavelent Chromium standards adopted by the State Water Board. The State Water Board is requiring WEMWC develop a compliance plan that will enable the delivery of water that meets the new water quality standards by 2020. The proposed annexation will facilitate compliance by having Yuba City deliver domestic drinking water to WEMWC.
