## Contingency – 10 Year Survey

- Average utilized for typical contracts over last 10 years:
  - -4.1 percent
- Contract price range:
  - \$7,950 (Franklin-Monterey Backlot Sewer Repair)
  - \$11,146,923.20 (Plumas Street Improvements)
- Contract project types:
  - Public improvements, roads, utilities, City facilities



# Contingency – Neighboring Cities

- Staff surveyed recent projects from:

- Cities utilized 10 percent contingency as a standard at project award



- Requested Financial Aid to repair the damages from Cal-OES/FEMA
- Application for Ponds has been approved
- Application for Access Road under review by FEMA, waiting for information from City
  - Need to complete preliminary design to provide information

- Jacobs Engineering Group Inc. was selected for the diffuser project in 2018 through a competitive process
- Jacobs will prepare the necessary engineering design and environmental documents to bid the projects

- FEMA and Cal-OES 93.75%
- Access Road \$147,464
  - Approximately \$50,000 for preliminary design
- Ponds \$252,292
  - Approximately \$80,000 for additional required work not in the approved scope






#### 2019 Resurfacing Project – Background

- Public Works is responsible for maintenance of public streets within the City.
- Project proposes to maintain City roadways with the following maintenance methods:
  - .25" Micro Milling
  - Asphalt Rubber Cape Seals
  - Double-chip Asphalt Rubber Cape Seals
- Repair methods determined based on roadway condition, roadway category, and cost efficiency.

### 2019 Resurfacing Project – Vicinity Map






#### 2019 Resurfacing Project - Poole Blvd Thin Blue Line
