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### Yuba City Residential Street Light Maintenance Districts: Background

- City annually levies and collects special assessments to maintain lighting improvements.
- These Districts were formed under County jurisdiction.
- City took over Districts administration when annexed into the City.
- Districts were historically charged the maximum levy prior to 2009 to allow reserves to build up.
- Since 2009, Council approved reduced assessments.

# Yuba City Residential Street Light Maintenance Districts: Analysis

- Proposed assessments in Tierra Buena Area lower than FY 18/19
  - Low operating costs & high reserves
- Operating & maintenance costs in Walton Area for FY 18/19 were higher than maximum levy
  - Walton Area to receive max levy to keep pace with costs


### Yuba City Residential Street Light Maintenance Districts: Fiscal Impact

<u>District</u>	<u>Revenue</u>	<u>Expenditures</u>	Projected Reserve Fund Balance as of 7/1/20*
Tierra Buena Area	\$22,000	\$24,950	\$127,218
Walton Area	\$81,677	\$81,443	(\$66,122)


- Due to past billing changes with PG&E Tierra Buena has been overcharged while Walton was undercharged.
- Moving forward, proposed levy changes will correct revenueexpenditure imbalances.

## Yuba City Residential Street Light Maintenance Districts: Recommendation

- A. Conduct a Public Hearing
- B. Adopt a resolution confirming the diagram and assessment and levying the assessment for Fiscal Year 19/20, pursuant to the Benefit Assessment Act of 1982.
