

# What is the CAPER?


- Consolidated Annual Performance and Evaluation Report (CAPER)
- Report required of jurisdictions that receive Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds
- Yuba City is an entitlement jurisdiction receiving a federal formula grant (based on population) from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Renewal (HUD)
- This program provides funding to expand economic opportunities, and provide decent housing, & suitable living environments, for low & moderate income persons



# How much did YC Receive?


- The City received \$650,001 for last fiscal year

<i>Expenditure Breakdown</i>	<i>Amount (\$)</i>
Public Services (15%)	\$97,500
Housing Programs/Public Facilities & Improvements	\$422,501
Planning & Administration (20%)	\$130,000
<b>Total Expenditures</b>	<b>\$650,001</b>




# What happens with the funds?

- **Housing Rehabilitation Activities:**
  - ✓ Senior Handyman Program: 14 low-income seniors received services to complete minor home repairs.
  - ✓ FREED Home Repair Program: 25 disabled residents received home improvements for accessibility.



# What happens with the funds?


- **Housing Rehabilitation Activities:**
  - ✓ Habitat for Humanity Yuba-Sutter Exterior Home Repair Program: 2 low-income, disabled, and/or senior citizens were provided Exterior Home Repair services.
  - ✓ Owner-Occupied Housing Rehabilitation Program: 1 low-income senior residents were assisted through this program.



# What happens with the funds?

- **Public Service Activities:**


- ✓ Sutter Yuba Homeless Consortium: 1,889 persons experiencing temporary homelessness were provided support services.
- ✓ The Sutter Yuba Homeless Consortium partners with Central Valley Homeless Veterans, Bridges to Housing, and Hands of Hope.



# What happens with the funds?


- **Public Facilities Improvements:**

- ✓ ADA Facility Improvements
  - ✓ Ongoing City-wide Project (Estimated 5,160 persons benefited thus far)
- ✓ Sam Brannan Pickle Ball Courts
  - ✓ Estimated 3,095 persons benefited (Census Tract 502.02)
- ✓ River City Manor & Kingwood Commons
  - ✓ 73 low-income rental units were assisted.



# Public Outreach

- The City is required to solicit feedback on the City's efforts and accomplishments.
- The 15-day public comment period was between August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2019.
- The City received no comments.



# Recommendation

- Accept comments that the City received during the public comment period.
  - Note: To date, no public comments were received.
- Approve the CAPER & Resolution authorizing staff to submit all necessary documents to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).
