Purpose:

To address County-wide homelessness and vagrancy concerns and find proposed solutions.

Background:

Councilmember Cardoza serves on the City's Bi-County Homeless Authority Board. Councilmember Grace Espindola serves as the alternate.

The City Council of Yuba City and the Sutter County Board of Supervisors also held two Joint Public Workshops to discuss mutual concerns regarding the growing problem of homelessness and vagrancy within Yuba City and Sutter County. The Workshops were designed to have all the elected officials on the same page and working together to find solutions that will work for the community. The elected officials requested the formation of an Ad Hoc Committee to discuss the feasibility of some of the ideas that were brought forward.

The Sutter County Homeless Ad Hoc Committee is made up of Sutter County Supervisors Ron Sullenger and Mike Ziegenmeyer and City Council Members Manny Cardoza and Grace Espindola.

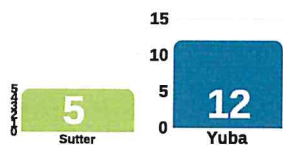

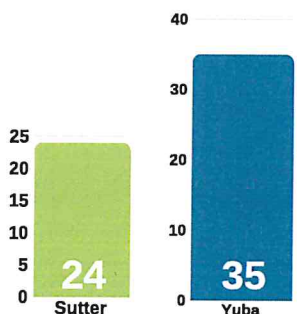

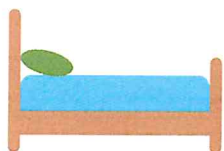
New Households with Children entered into HMIS

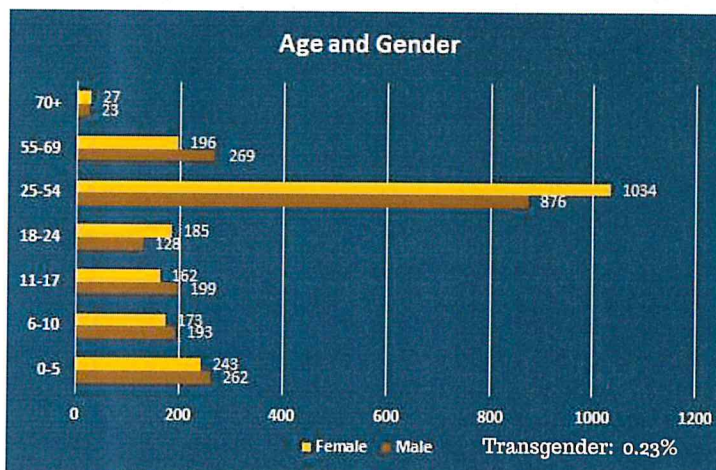

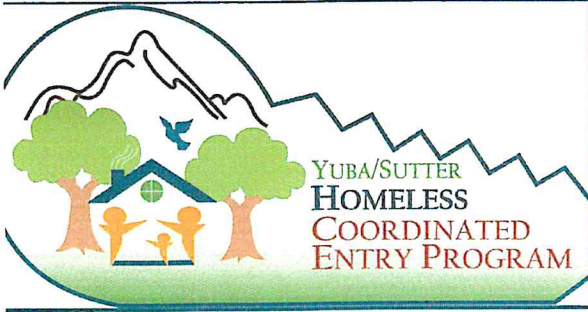

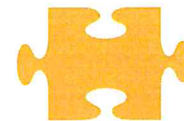
