Yuba City Lighting and Landscape District Nos. 2-6: Background

- City annually levies and collects special assessments to maintain lighting and landscaping improvements
- Assessments approved by property owners of record at the time Districts were formed
- District Nos. 2-6 have provisions for a cost of living adjustment (COLA)
- COLA is based on Consumer Price Index from January to January

Yuba City Lighting and Landscape District Nos. 2-6: Analysis

- Engineer's Annual Reports have been prepared
- District Nos. 2, 3, 5*, and 6 will see increases in their annual levies, while District 4 will see a decrease
- Levies raised in response to inflation
- District 4's levy decreased due to sufficient reserves and revenue that exceeded expenditures
- *All Zones of Benefit within District 5 will see an increase except for Zone of Benefit A

Yuba City Lighting and Landscape District Nos. 2-6: Fiscal Impact



^{*}The Projected Reserve Fund Balance is the Total of the Capital Replacement Reserve plus the Operating Reserve.


Yuba City Lighting and Landscape District Nos. 2-6: Alternatives

1. Direct the modification of the assessment amounts which will affect future revenue and expenditure amounts in FY 2020/21, or cancel the Districts and find alternative funding sources to maintain the lighting and landscaping.

Yuba City Lighting and Landscape District Nos. 2-6: Recommendation



- A. Conduct a public hearing
- B. Adopt a resolution confirming and ordering the annual levy of assessments for Fiscal Year 2020/21 for the Yuba City Lighting and Landscape Maintenance District Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, & 6 (Town Center, 69 subdivisions throughout Yuba City including the Palisades Subdivisions and Butte Vista neighborhood, and commercial district), pursuant to the Landscaping and Lighting Act of 1972.
