

The 5th Street Bridge Replacement Project will enhance safety, inter-regional traffic circulation, and air quality. The improvements will include a 4-lane, 10 span cast-in-place post-tensioned concrete box girder bridge which connects 5th Street in Marysville to Bridge Street in Yuba City.

The Council Minute



Boards and Commissions

PERSONNEL BOARD

This Board meets on an as-needed basis and primarily acts as a hearing board in matters related to employee disciplinary appeals. The Board, when requested by the City Council, may also study and/or recommend actions related to personnel matters within the City. Applicants must reside within the corporate limits of the City.

SENIOR COMMISSION

The members of the Senior Commission focus on preserving and improving the quality of life for older citizens in the community. The Commission advises City Council on a wide range of issues relevant to older adults. The Commission also provides opportunities to educate seniors, their families and caregivers on these issues. Applicants must be at least 55 years of age & reside within the corporate limits of the City.

YOUTH COMMISSION

The Youth Commission acts in an advisory capacity to the City Council concerning issues relating to youth activities and involvement. This Commission works closely with the Parks and Recreation Department. Applicants must reside within the corporate limits of the City and be between the ages of 12 to 19.
