Background



- Public Works has prepared an application for the Bureau of Reclamation's WaterSMART: Small-Scale Efficiency Grant.
- Used the City's 2019 Water Master Plan and maintenance records to identify project.
- Proposing replacement of split-case pumps and soft start systems at booster pump stations.

Background (cont.)







<u>Analysis</u>



- The Bureau of Reclamation requires Resolution by governing body for grant application to be considered.
 - Designate official with legal authority
 - Support application
 - Affirm City's capability to provide local funds
 - Commit to working with the Bureau to meet deadlines
- Staff recommends designating the Public Works Director as the official with legal authority.

Alternatives



- Do not support the grant application.
- Designate a different official, such as the City Manager.

Recommendations



 Adopt a Resolution designating the Public Works Director as the official who can enter into an agreement and who has reviewed and supports the application submitted, confirming the City's capability to provide the amount of funding or in-kind contributions as specified in funding plan, and that the City will work with Bureau of Reclamation to meet established deadlines for entering into a grant or cooperative agreement.
