# **Summary**

## Purpose:

To provide an update on the City's current water supply outlook.

# **Background:**

The City of Yuba City obtains water for its water system through four different permits/contracts from the Feather River (Table A). The City also has access to one groundwater well located at the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) for use in drought or emergency conditions.

Historically, SWRCB License 13855 (License 13855) and the North Yuba Water District (NYWD) have been reliable sources of water. During below normal runoff years, SWRCB Permit 18558 (Permit 18558) is typically restricted so that no water can be drawn under the permit starting May through September. The DWR State Water Project Contract (SWP Contract) is typically subject to restrictions, with the most severe restrictions occurring in 2014 with a 5% allotment.

During California's 2013-2017 drought, the City utilized the backup groundwater well at the WTP, "carryover" water from the SWP Contract to supplement supplies, and encouraged customers to

conserve water. Customers did an excellent job reducing consumption during the 2013-2017 drought, and adopted long-term habits that reduced water consumption overall. Through these efforts, the City was able to meet water demands. The City's contractual water supply, historical water uses for 2013-2020, and projected water demand for 2021 are shown in Figure 1.

# Analysis:

On March 23, 2021, the Department of Water Resources issued *Notice to State Water Contractors No. 21-06: 2021 State Water Project Allocation Decrease – 5 Percent* to decrease the 2021 water allocation to 5% due to persistent dry conditions. With a SWP Contract supply of 5%, it is anticipated that the City will need to utilize the backup groundwater well at the WTP and "carryover" water from previous allocations of the SWP Contract to meet projected demands. Table B shows water available for 2021.

With a projected water demand of 15,228 AF and available water supply of 17,218 AF, there should be enough water to meet demands for 2021. However, if the persistent dry conditions continue beyond 2021, there may be issues in meeting current water demands. The City is in the process of updating the Urban Water Management Plan, including the Water Shortage Contingency Plan. Should water supplies become an issue, the City will implement the Water Shortage Contingency Plan.

To increase awareness of the persistent dry conditions in California, staff will prepare educational materials to distribute to customers regarding water rebate programs available through the City for WaterSense® labeled toilets, smart irrigation controls, and showerheads, the importance of checking irrigation systems to make sure they are working properly, and other ways to manage water consumption. Also, with the Cellular Meter Retrofit project that is currently under construction, customers will be able to access real-time water usage information, including notifications of potential leaks.





Due to the persistent dry conditions, the Department of Water Resources (DWR) is decreasing the allocation of 2021 State Water Project (SWP) water for long-term contractors from 422,848 acre-feet to 210,266 acre-feet. Based on the recent low amount of precipitation and runoff, and an assessment of overall water supply conditions, SWP supplies are projected to be 5 percent of most SWP contractors' 2021 requested Table A amounts, which totals 4,172,786 AF. Attached is the revised 2021 SWP 5 percent allocation table.

This allocation is made consistent with the long-term water supply contracts and public policy. DWR's approval considered several factors including existing storage in SWP conservation reservoirs, SWP operational constraints such as the conditions of the 2019 Biological Opinions for federally listed species, the 2020 Incidental Take Permit for State listed species and the 2021 SWP contractors' demands. DWR may revise this and any subsequent allocations if warranted by the developing hydrologic and water supply conditions.

To develop the 5 percent schedule, DWR will scale down the current long-term SWP contractors' 15 percent schedules that were submitted in October 2020 (as part of the initial requests), unless SWP contractors submit updated schedules. DWR will send the approved monthly water delivery schedules to the long-term SWP contractors.
