#### REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL

The Governor has declared a State of Emergency to exist in California as a result of the threat of COVID-19 (aka the "Coronavirus"). The Governor also issued **Executive Order N-33-20**, which directs Californians to follow public health directives including canceling large gatherings. The Executive Order also allows local legislative bodies to hold meetings via conference calls while still meeting state transparency requirements. The City is providing multiple alternatives to viewing Council meetings and providing comments on items on the agenda, including:

- <u>Web Conference</u>: The meeting will be conducted live over the internet by PC or Smartphone. Members of the public can join the web-based virtual meeting. (See instructions, below.)

- <u>Public Attendance:</u> Due to COVID-19, residents are encouraged to attend the City Council meeting via web conference or submit comments by email. Consistent with public health guidelines for social distancing, seating is available in the Council Chamber. If an attendee does not have a facial covering, one will be provided. Comments may be made from the Council Chamber podium. Please participate via web conference or email if you are ill or have been exposed to COVID-19.
