SUTTER COUNTY SMALL BUSINESS EMERGENCY ECONOMIC RELIEF GRANT PROGRAM

- 5 Rounds of funding for business and non-profits
- No repayment required
- 231 grants totaling \$2,616,176
- 104 grants to Yuba City businesses totaling \$2,387,330
- 10 grants to Live Oak businesses totaling \$144,500
