Yuba City Hero Receives Life Saving Medal

On March 5, 2014, **Police Officer Kulbeer Hundal** received the Yuba City Police Life Saving medal from Police Chief Rob Landon. Officer Hundal responded to a welfare check request on a young woman who did not show-up for work. After discovering there was no apartment manager on site, Officer Hundal climbed into the upstairs apartment and found the young woman unconscious on the floor, with her four month old daughter lying in the bed near her mother. The young woman was in a diabetic emergency and would have died within hours without Officer Hundal's rescue.

This incident was brought to light by his peers and supervisor who felt his actions were nothing short of heroic, and helped prevent the death of this young mother and possible serious harm to her infant.
