Screamatorium - Haunted House

The owners of the building stepped up and agreed to a minimal rent (\$1,000) for use of the building from now until the middle of November. Construction of the attraction will begin in the next two weeks.

800 Northgate Drive Purchase Offer Cancelled

The \$1.1 million purchase offer for 800 Northgate Drive was cancelled Tuesday July 9, 2013. Although further direction was given to the City Manager to evaluate alternative uses for the property, no additional alternative uses could be identified for immediate City use. The City Council cancelled the agreement during the due diligence phase, subsequently the \$25,000 earnest money deposit is being refunded to the City.

The Yuba City Council is supportive of the concept of incubator space as a mechanism to attract new and creative job base industries to our community. We are hopeful that this idea will gain traction in the community and that private business expressing an interest in this type of facility will move forward with this concept.

Yuba City is very grateful to the land owner, bank and broker in working with us over an extended period of time on this issue.

Smart Cities

This year, the NPR Cities Project is covering the concept of "smart cities": how cities worldwide are experimenting with technology to solve all sorts of urban problems. Policymakers hope implementing technological solutions to urban issues will help cities become more efficient, more user-friendly and more environmentally sustainable.

But are these cities smart? The creation and implementation of a new digital urban infrastructure also raises lots of questions. A smartphone may offer new opportunities for civic engagement, but will people who can't afford one be left behind? While camera networks may aid police in fighting crime, do they compromise individual privacy? Will the troves of social media and mobile phone data really reveal enough information about human behavior to help cities address global climate change?

In short, is the drive toward a new kind of "technopolis" a boondoggle or a boon for cities?

DID YOU KNOW?

Early politicians required feedback from the public to determine what the people considered important. Since there were no telephones, TV's or radios, the politicians sent their assistants to local taverns, pubs and bars. They were told to 'go sip some ale' and listen to people's conversations and political concerns. Many assistants were dispatched at different times — "you go sip here" and "you go sip there". The two words "go sip" were eventually combined when referring to the local opinion and, thus we have the term 'gossip'.
